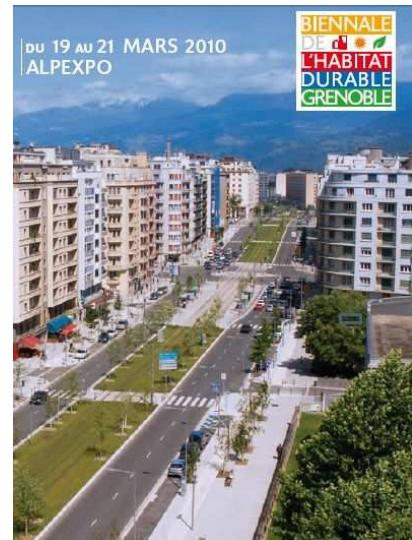
In the framework of the CONCERTO-SESAC project a seminar on Renewable Energy Sources (RES) is organised on 25-26 March 2010 in Grenoble, France.

The objective of the RES Seminar is to share technical information on the energy provider side. Several topics will be presented starting with energy planning, use of biomass in several district heating networks and cooling networks and electricity - from solar electricity towards a new smart grid. An incursion into other experiences such as biogas or mini CHP (combined heat and power) will also be ensured. Except the experience of Grenoble, other European cities such as Växjö (Sweden), Delft (The Netherlands), Geneva (Switzerland) and Lyon (France) will present their different know-how.

This event will take place under the umbrella of the 3rd Sustainable Housing Biennial, the European Wood Conference and Exhibition in Grenoble as well as the European Sustainable Energy Week.

On the 26th of March, the seminar will be followed by site visits to Grenoble.

The Sustainable Alpine Cities Seminar will take place in parallel with the site visits. This seminar will offer you the possibility to have a general view on topics such as energy efficient refurbishment of existing buildings, wood strategy (construction /energy), social innovation, etc.
